

Download Ikebana With Living Plants

Ikebana (いけばな, "arranging flowers" or "making flowers alive") is the Japanese art of flower arrangement. It is also known as Kadō (かど, "way of flowers"). The tradition dates back to the 7th century when floral offerings were made at altars. Later, they were placed in the tokonoma (alcove) of a home. Ikebana reached its first zenith in the 16th century under the influence of ...Welcome to Exotic Plants. A local, family owned business like no other in Sacramento. The truth about the origin of Ikebana is unknown. But it is thought to have come to Japan as part of Buddhist practice. Others say that from pre-Buddhist times, Japanese used evergreen trees and flowers to invoke nature gods and claim that this practice is at the heart of secular ikebana.
