

# Download Saul On The Road To Damascus

The Renaissance Italian master Caravaggio painted two works depicting the event: *The Conversion of Saint Paul* and *Conversion on the Way to Damascus*. Peter Paul Rubens also produced several works on the theme. Michelangelo's *The Conversion of Saul* is housed in the Cappella Paolina of the Vatican Palace. Acts 9 Bible Study. During Saul's time, "Arabia" (Galatians 1:17) referred to the kingdom of the Nabatean Arabs that stretched from Damascus to the Red Sea, covering parts of modern Syria, Jordan, Israel and Saudi Arabia. It was much smaller compared to modern Saudi Arabia. On the Road to Damascus. 'There you will be told what you must do.' When Saul gets up and opens his eyes, he can't see a thing. He is blind! So the men with him take him by the hand and lead him into Damascus. Jesus now speaks to one of his disciples in Damascus, saying: 'Get up, An·a·ni·as. Go to the street called Straight. At the house of Judas ask for a man named Saul. Even though Saul received his commission from Jesus on the road, he still had to go into Damascus and be told what to do—meet with Ananias who laid hands on him, receive the Holy Spirit, be baptized, and be received by the disciples there (Acts 9:15–16, 19; 22:12–16).
